

Utah Statewide Immunization Information System (USIIS) Monthly Report for July 2005

HL7: USIIS staff have been working with a Utah Department of Health initiative to determine the feasibility of a department-wide HL7 gateway. While the department-wide effort is in development, USIIS will continue its own HL7 expansion with an eye on linking to the department-wide gateway in the future. **Contact Nancy Paré at 801-538-6871 or npare@utah.gov.**

AIMS: The new version of AIMS (Adult Immunization Management System) will be much easier to navigate and understand. Great lengths have been taken to make user accessibility easier and the overall flow of the program more understandable. The login page uses client side code to remember the last username and provider that logged in, so only a password is necessary. Different areas of the program are now contained in the header and are accessible from every area of the program. WebKIDS User Tip: Did you know that WebKIDS uses the actual name of the immunization instead of the brand name? For instance, Menactra is MENINGOCOCCAL A,C,Y,W-135 DIPHTHERIA CONJUGATE , and Boostrix is Tdap. If you are looking for an immunization to enter, then don't look for the brand name. Here is a list of common brand names and their vaccine codes and how WebKIDS lists them:
